CSIR, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan-IIT Delhi and Vijnana Bharati sign a tripartite MoU

- The MoU is to provide access to Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (CSIR) rural technologies for UBA and is expected to lay the foundation for cooperation and joint action in the area of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) for rural development of India.
- The objective is to adopt CSIR technologies and related knowledge base in tune with the people's aspirations in furtherance of initiatives such as UBA and Vijnana Bharati (VIBHA).
- The MoU will map the road for effective coordination between CSIR, IIT Delhi, and Vijnana Bharti (Vibha) towards meeting the objectives of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan.

Green-Ag project launched in Mizoram to bring transformative change in the farm

- Green-Agriculture (Green-Ag), a project funded by Global Environment Facility (GEF) was launched in Mizoram.
- The aim of the project is to speed up the transformation of Indian agriculture sector into national and international benefits by Greenland management practices, concerns of biodiversity and climate change.
- Mizoram is first among the **5 states** where the project is to be implemented. The other states are **Madhya Pradesh, Odisha, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand**.
- Agriculture minister of Mizoram C Lalrinsanga launched the project.

ADB Approves 3 Million USD Grant to India to Support COVID-19 Response

- The Asian Development Bank (ADB) approved the 3 Million USD grant of about Rs.22 Crore from the ADB's Asia Pacific Disaster Response Fund (APDRF), financed by Japanese government to India to support the Government's emergency response to COVID-19.
- The grant will be utilised to procure thermal scanners and other essential commodities to increase the strength of Indian Governments COVID-19 response.
