### No NEFT charges for savings account holders from Jan 2020, RBI mandates banks

- The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has mandated banks not to charge savings account holders for NEFT with effect from January 2020.
- it had done away with charges on NEFT and RTGS transactions.
- In order to provide an impetus to digital funds movement, it has been decided to do away with the charges levied by the Reserve Bank for transactions processed in the RTGS and NEFT systems. Banks will be required, in turn, to pass these benefits to their customers. Instructions to banks in this regard will be issued within a week.

### Karnataka Gramin Bank initiates 'mobile ATMs' to push digitisation in rural areas

- In a move to boost digitisation in rural areas, the Karnataka Gramin Bank (KGB) has launched 'mobile ATMs' in Kalaburagi among several other districts in the state.
- The special vehicle includes an ATM and a screen to show videos of different banking schemes.
- The mobile ATMs will go to the doorsteps of the farmers and make them aware of the banking schemes and digital operating systems.
