Green Climate Fund approves USD 256 million for Bangladesh

- The Green Climate Fund (GCF) has approved dollar 256 million for Bangladesh in grants and loans to meet its Green House Gas (GHG) emission reduction targets under the Paris agreement.
- The financing provided as an integrated package for textile and Ready Made Garments (RMG) sectors of Bangladesh are the largest industrial contributors in carbon emission.
- By 2030, Bangladesh is committed to reduce its GHG emission by 15 percent compared to business-as-usual scenario.
- The funding will facilitate capacity building, awareness raising, policy development and support in loan disbursal and evaluation of programme parameters to textile and RMG sectors in Bangladesh.
- GCF was set up under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in 2010 as the world's largest dedicated fund to help developing countries reduce their carbon emissions.
